


## **How to Become an Airline Pilot?**

Whether you are starting out in aviation or already have a licence, if you want to pursue a job with one of the European airlines, you will find the right path for your development at Bartolini Air. Upon graduation, you will have the skills and knowledge necessary to successfully pass an airline pilot interview at any airline and become a great airline pilot. This is our ultimate goal.



### **Integrated Training**

Integrated training is the most complete, most effective, and fastest route for people with no aviation experience who want to become airline pilots. After 18 to 24 months, you will receive a so-called frozen Air Transport Pilot Licence issued according to EASA regulations. This entitles you to apply directly for the position of First Officer in any airline in Europe. The next step in your career progression will be to qualify for the position of Captain.



### **Modular Training**

Modular training is the perfect solution if you want to complete your education gradually and get to your dream job in the cockpit at your own pace. Modular training also allows you to complete only selected parts of your training at Bartolini Air (e.g. if you have your private pilot licence, you can join us for more advanced stages of the frozen ATPL training). Each module of the training is independent of others - e.g. you can do the private licence this year and return to supplement it with your instrument and multi-engine ratings next year.

# What are the Requirements to Enrol in the Bartolini Air Training Programme?

The ab initio ATPL(A) integrated training requirements are similar to those for a commercial pilot licence:



Be at least 17 years old.



Obtain an EASA class I medical certificate.



Demonstrate successful completion of secondary education (e.g. high school or equivalent).



Produce a criminal record check (CRC) basic disclosure certificate.



Have a good level of English proficiency.




Successfully complete an aptitude assessment with Bartolini Air.

In modular training, the qualification requirements depend on the stage of the training and your current certificates.

# Ryanair Future Flyer Academy

Bartolini Air and Ryanair have formed a partnership to train pilots according to Ryanair's standards and procedures to the level required to join the airline. The Ryanair Future Flyer Academy (formerly known as the Ryanair Mentored Programme) is a training programme that allows you, even with little or no prior aviation experience, to obtain a frozen ATPL licence and have a direct path to becoming a Ryanair pilot. It now includes a conditional job offer guarantee and a type rating course funded by the airline subject to a training agreement. Candidates for the programme undergo a Ryanair aptitude test before joining, which assures both the airline and you that the training effort is worthwhile and that you are capable of becoming a top airline pilot up to the highest Ryanair's standards.

### **Training Paths:**



#### Integrated Ab Initio:

A full-time 'zero-to-hero' course that takes 18 to 24 months to complete, suitable if you are starting with no prior flight experience and you want to become an airline pilot within the shortest possible timeframe.



#### Gateway 1:

A modular route suitable if you already hold a Private Pilot Licence (PPL) and have completed at least 100 hours as Pilot in Command (PIC) along with ATPL theory exams.



#### Gateway 2:

The Airline Pilot Standard
Multi-Crew Cooperation
course (APS MCC)
designed for you if you
already possess a CPL(A)
licence together with
IR/ME and ME ratings
and have completed
the AUPRT course.

Ab initio and Modular Gateway 1 students receive a conditional job offer already upon course enrolment, whilst Gateway 2 graduates get exclusive access to fast-track recruitment at Ryanair.

The Ryanair Future Flyer Academy (RFFA) is currently available for candidates with a full right to live and work in the European Union, United Kingdom, or Morocco; it has two variations depending on where you come from and which Ryanair Group airline you are going to fly for:

- The European Union and Morocco: This course is designed for the citizens of the European Union (except those who are willing to fly for Buzz and be based in Eastern Europe) and Morocco. It includes a conditional job offer upon enrolment and the graduates are eligible for a type rating course funded by the airline subject to a training agreement.
- **The UK:** This course is designed for the citizens of the United Kingdom. It includes a conditional job offer upon enrolment and the graduates are eligible for a type rating course funded by the airline subject to a training agreement.





# What is Special about the Ryanair Future Flyer Academy with Bartolini Air?



#### **Employment Opportunities:**

Graduates of the Academy are given conditional job offers and are eligible for a Type Rating course funded by the airline subject to a training agreement, which prepares them for the position of Second Officer with Ryanair.



#### **Total Training Cost:**

We are completely transparent about the total training cost, including the type rating, which can be viewed online. Financial assistance is also available.



#### **Career Progression:**

The Academy not only provides initial training but also supports long-term career growth. Successful graduates have access to Ryanair's fast-track Route-to-Command programme, which accelerates your career path, enabling you to become a Captain within four years. The programme offers competitive salaries, industry-leading rosters, and numerous base locations across Europe.

Bartolini Air is among a select group of only six pilot training centres across Europe that have been chosen to participate in the Ryanair Future Flyer Academy programme. This partnership, established in July 2019, highlights Bartolini Air's commitment to excellence in pilot training and its role in shaping the next generation of Ryanair pilots. Since joining the programme, Bartolini Air has provided rigorous training that includes both theoretical and practical components, preparing you to undertake the Ryanair type rating course. This collaboration not only reinforces Bartolini Air's status as a toptier flight academy but also provides you with direct access to a promising career in one of the world's largest airline groups.

A well-performing student of another (so-called "white-tail") training programme with Bartolini Air may be offered a promotion to the Ryanair Future Flyer Academy.



# **Airline Recruitment Process**

Upon graduation you will apply to your airline (or airlines) of choice and then go through a pilot recruitment process (unless you have received an initial job offer upon enrolment as a Ryanair Future Flyer Academy student). That complex and demanding process aims to select the best-prepared candidates and includes several key stages like psychometric tests, a flight simulator assessment, and a technical and behavioural interview. Their goal is to ensure that prospective pilots possess the necessary skills, knowledge, and personal qualities to upload the responsibility of this highly demanding role. Hence the purpose of your training at Bartolini Air is not only your licences and ratings. Above all we want to make you an outstanding, comprehensively trained pilot able to pass any airline assessment with flying colours. This is our ultimate goal and our commitment to you.

# **Pilot Salaries**

The salaries of airline pilots vary depending on experience, position, and the type of airline. Below are the average gross salaries in euros for different pilot career levels.

Position	Monthly Salary (gross)	Annual Salary (gross)
Cadet Pilot	1500€ - 2500€	18 000€ - 30 000€
Second Officer (Entry Level)	2500€ - 3500€	30 000€ - 42 000€
First Officer (Entry Level)	4000€ - 5500€	48 000€ - 66 000€
First Officer (Experienced)	5500€ - 8000€	66 000€ - 96 000€
Captain (Entry Level)	8 000€ - 12 000€	96 000€ - 144 000€
Captain (Experienced)	12 000€ - 18 000€	144 000€ - 216 000€

## **Our Fleet**

Bartolini Air's fleet consists of over 30 modern and new (up to 5 years old), comfortable, safe aircraft made by Tecnam, one of the world leaders in manufacturing piston training aeroplanes.

All of them are equipped with EFIS (glass cockpit) avionics, so our students accustomed to the layout of the primary flight display of modern jet planes. Each of the aircraft models that we use meets different requirements relevant to particular phases of the training and the skills that they focus on.

Thanks to a homogenous fleet and in-house maintenance, we keep a large stock of spare parts and make repairs overnight so aircraft downtime due to technical reasons is minimised.



#### Tecnam P2008JC

At Bartolini Air, from the first flight, you will enjoy one of the world's most modern training aircraft - the TECNAM P2008JC. It's very reliable (which is crucial because no one wants to handle an engine failure during one of the first solo flights) as well as very easy and pleasant to handle.

The TECNAM P2008JC is equipped with dual-screen Garmin G3X avionics, which means the instrument scan you practise is very similar to all your future aircraft, including even Boeings and Airbuses.



#### Tecnam P2006T

It is lighter than most twin-engine aeroplanes used for for multi-engine piston (land) training, and it is equipped with two Rotax engines, which makes it very efficient in terms of fuel consumption.

The P2006T is fully equipped with Garmin 1000 NXi avionics with SBAS-augmented GPS, which allows the aircraft to fly almost all kinds of instrument approaches including required navigation performance (RNP) approaches down to localizer performance with vertical guidance (LPV) minima. Note that most Airbuses and Boeings around the world are not yet equipped for LPV approaches!



#### **Tecnam P-Mentor**

We are the first flight academy in the world to use the two-seater Tecnam P-Mentor, which has full instrument flight rules (IFR), performance-based navigation (PBN) and area navigation (RNAV) certification. It boasts an impressively low average fuel consumption of just 14 litres per hour.



#### CAP 10C NG

It's an aerobatic aircraft used by Bartolini Air for advanced upset prevention and recovery training (AUPRT). It is unique because, unlike most aerobatic aircraft where the instructor sits behind the student pilot, the CAP 10C NG features side-by-side seating. This arrangement significantly enhances instructor-pilot communication and also allows for a cockpit configuration that closely resembles that of an airliner.
